sarah bowen gallery is honored to present works by conceptual artist, Peter Eudenbach. Eudenbach's work takes the form of transformed objects, found materials, video, as well as fantastical public art proposals. His work populates a surreal landscape that wryly recalls the obsessions of a medieval alchemist. Through the use of sculpture, installation, video, and multiples, Eudenbach explores the history of ideas, while toying with our expectations of the commonplace.

*My work reflects an interest in how close function can be to absurdity. The catalyst for my work is intuition, which is made tangible in the finished pieces.*

*My videos occupy a zone between discrete sequences and moving photographs. I see them as vignettes or isolated scenarios that emphasize causal relationships. In this way I believe that video can be more like dance, music, or poetry - taking place in time while existing on its own terms.*

Eudenbach's solo show will include video, a coffee table that makes coffee, a tricked out carpet sweeper, and public proposals, like *Electrophorus Electricus*, where the artist imagines an interactive circuit between a viewer and an electric eel with the aid of copper conductors.

Eudenbach's diverse range of work has included site-specific sculptural projects at **Socrates Sculpture Park** in Long Island City and **The Islip Art Museum** in East Islip, NY.

His videos have been shown at: **Ars Electronica** in Linz, Austria, **Future of Film Conference** in Lisbon, the **Fringe Short Film Festival** in Goteburg, Sweden, and locally at **Nisus-Galeria Galou**, **Ocularis**, **Rooftop Video**, The **Bauhaus Café**, and The **Tugboat Film and Video Festival**. Online venues include **thebitscreen.com** and **tensecondfilms.com**. Eudenbach lives and works in Norfolk, Virginia, where he is a Lecturer in the Art Department at Old Dominion University.
